PERSONNA STORY FOR RIXENDE DE ROUEN

Born in May of 1102 in Rouen, Normandy to a Knight sworn to William the Conqueror. The Knight had served in the conquest of England, but chose to return home to his wife rather than remaining on the newly conquered island.

Rixende was the first child, and unfortunately a girl. Through the years, her father loved her, but wished for a son to continue the family line. Through the years and his continue service to William, he learned of the birth of the Princess Matilda (Maude) when Rixende was around 4 years old. He began to form a plan. Through the years he and her mother began to train Rixende in the ways of keeping a noble's home and attending a royal.

Meanwhile he began sending messages to King William. After a few years, His Majesty agreed it was time for his young daughter to be surround be attendants near her age. In 1112, at the age of ten she made the voyage across the English Channel to serve her Princess. After several years at Court, Matilda was married off to the Holy Roman Emperor, and she and her ladies began the voyage to her new home in 1116. The Emperor was very kind, and looked at his wife more like his child than his bride. He educated her, and by default Rixende was educated while working with Matilda and her lessons.

Eventually the Emperor passed away, and Empress Matilda was enjoying a fine life as the Dowager Empress. That was, until William called Matilda home due to the death of his son, and the need of an heir to the throne. William had the nobles swear allegiance to Matilda as his heir should he pass away. While they all bended knee, this was not a popular decision. This unrest led Rixende to seek a new path in uncharted lands of Meridies.

After an uneventful passage at sea, she settled in uncharted lands which are now known as the Shire of Loch Bais. Rixende continued her studies in music and matters of state. During these studies her region became the Region of Glean Abhann, and she earned the rank of Lady. Over time, her studies lead her to the other side of the Kingdom of Meridies. It was here that she met a dashing young herald. This herald swept her off her feet, and soon the celebrated marriage and a male heir as they established their home in Atlantia, where Rixende learned the art of Lampworking. However, their time in Atlantia was short when they were called to Ansteorra.

They have been in Ansteorra for fourteen years, and over time have added a daughter. In Ansteorra, Rixende began learning the ways of the sword, as well as continuing her corruption as a heraldic display maven with the addition of silk banner design and creation to her growing list of talents. Her herald was elevated to a Knight, and in Anno Societatus 43 they were elevated to the rank of Baron and Baroness of the Court of Ansteorra.
