





DA'UD BOB MOVIE REVIEW: THE TAMING OF THE SHREW



It's just amazing, really, the things that you can find while puttering about on the internet. And this month's movie is a good example of that. I mean, yeah, it's a film of one of Shakespeare's plays, and goodness knows there are plenty of those to be found. But it's especially remarkable in that it is the first film of a Shakespeare play with sound. And stars two of the leading actors of the day. (This was the first talkie film he had starred in; it was her second.) It helps the action in some ways that, like Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor in a later version, were really married to each other, in the only movie that they starred in together. On the downside, their mar-

riage was falling onto the rocks at the time, and it is thought that not all of the storminess between the two on the stage was acting. But there it was on Amazon, a total surprise, just waiting for your faithful reviewer to buy a copy and review it for you. So I did, and I have. And so this month, Da'ud Bob reviews for you 1929's **The Taming of the Shrew**

Starring Douglas Fairbanks as Petruchio, Mary Pickford as Katherine, Edwin Maxwell as Baptista, Joseph Cawthorn as Gremio, Clyde Cook as Grumio, Geoffrey Wardwell as Hortensio, and Dorothy Jordan as Bianca, the story is one that you should already be familiar with: out-of-town man comes to Verona to "thrive and wive" and is pointed in the direction of the house of Baptista, who will not let his younger daughter marry until the elder is wed, but her temper is such that she has driven off every potential suitor. So he sets out to "tame the shrew" and we find that he may not be as much in control as he thinks. It's one of Shakespeare's lightest comedies, and this film is also a sly subversion of the play's underlying misogyny. Does it have its weaknesses? Of course it does. Do its strengths outweigh those weaknesses? Almost. It's a mixed bag, but what a great opportunity to see a couple of legendary actors making the transition from silent films to talkies.

Good points: Petruchio's wearing a boot for a hat for his marriage to Katherine. Trying to get rid of the apple core in church. Petruchio's discomfiture on their wedding night. Mary Pickford's gloves. And when she smiles, she lights up the screen! (She doesn't do it often enough. But when she does smile, you can easily understand why she was named "America's sweetheart!")

Bad points: The musical instruments, especially what I think are supposed to be trumpets. There are no finger holes on the "bassoons." The costuming. Pickford's dresses, especially, make her look very good, but they're not period dresses by any means. Everyone is still unsure that talking movies are anything more than a passing fad, and many of the exaggerated postures and gesturing are carried over from silent films, and they seem overdone in a talkie. At a little over an hour of running time, a <u>lot</u> of the play has been cut. The transition from Petruchio's house to Katherine's final speech at her father's house is very sudden, leaving you feeling like you've missed something.

Zero breasts. No blood. No dead bodies. (Well, it <u>is</u> a Shakespearean comedy, after all, where no-body dies, unlike his tragedies, where <u>everyone</u> does.) Pillow fu. Dish fu. Lute fu. Whip fu. Pie fu. Singing fu. Fresh air fu. Stool fu. Hortensio rolls. Katherine's come "hither eyes" roll. Academy Award nomination to Douglas Fairbanks for his energy in the role of Petruchio; he brings a real enthusiasm for the part and it's a lot of fun to watch him moving all over the sets in his inimitable fashion. A mere 37 on the Vomit Meter. 2½ stars. Da'ud Bob says, "This would be worth watching for the historical value alone. But really, it's a wonderfully entertaining version of this play. Check it out!"

Word Up! Language fun with Wihtric

Wihtric greets his Baroness and the folk of Steppes!

We are firmly wrapping of Hréðemonað (Month of Hrethe) as my folk would reckon it, one month known for strong winds and strong storms. Gulf War was foremost an example.

For our word this edition, I thought I would continue addressing some basic terms, and start with the first title/rank most people earn in the SCA: Lord or lady.

Lord comes originally from the Anglo-Saxon hláford (my variation below is based on Anglian dialect), which is a contracted form of *hlaf-weard, literally "loaf warder, protector of sustenance (broadly)." This idea has pretty deep roots, as there is a runic inscription, witada halaiban, "bread giver/protector/companion," from the Tune runestone, dating from the mid 3rd to 5th centuries.

Lady comes from hlæfdíge with hláf, "loaf," as the root, and díge, which had the combined sense of "servant" and "(female) leader." Combined, the term comes to mean "loaf provider, loaf server," thus a compliment to the protector status of the lord.

In many ways, lord/lady were more statements of relationships between a leader and follower. While an entry level award in the SCA, due to largely later versions (Elizabethan, for example), it was view as a higher relationship among the elder English. One could be a royal thane, yet still a lord to another. Another note is in early English writs/charters, the consort to the King was often still called Lady, before they started injecting cwen, "queen." This was even the case with Latin version, domina, prior to regina.

Now for a something brought to my attention. A member of our fair barony wanted me to clarify a point of spelling and usage concerning populace, populus, and populous. Populace is a derivative of the Latin, populus, thus they can be (and are) used interchangeably in the Society as nouns for a group of people. Populous is an adjective meaning "having a large number." So one can have a populous populace or populous meeting, if enough people attend, but stating that the populous meeting is Thursday, meaning "the citizenry of the barony" would be incorrect. It does not help that spell check changed populus to populous three times writing this article. Time to see if the Chronicler catches it.




