
Those who kept the home fires burning, thank you for your diligence. You were sorely missed and a sight for sore eyes on our return home.

We will have new Rulers this month as well. Please come out and welcome Jason Drysdale and Margherita de Mantua as King and Queen of Ansteorra!





Da'ud Bob Movie Review: Centurion



There are times when you read the synopsis for a movie and you just know, deep in your heart of hearts and before even seeing the opening scenes of that movie, that like Vizzini in The Princess Bride, they "keep using that word. I do not think it means what [they] think it means." And in this particular instance, the word being bandied about was "decimate." To wit: "In second century Britain, a famed centurion and a handful of Roman soldiers try to survive behind enemy lines after Pict tribes decimate the platoon." And again, "A splinter group of Roman soldiers fight for their lives behind enemy lines after their legion is decimated in a devastating guerrilla attack." But "decimate" is not a synonym for "destroyed," which is how they are using it here. "Decimate: kill one in every ten of (a group of soldiers or others) as a punishment for the whole group." From the Latin "decem," meaning "ten." (From which we also get December, which under the Julian calendar was the tenth month of the year, not the twelfth as it is now.) No, in the movie the Ninth Legion (not "platoon") is not "decimated," it is almost completely wiped

out except for a handful of soldiers (which adds a whole lot to the body count, but contributes nothing to the understanding of what the word "decimate" really means. Anyway, despite this misgiving, we went ahead and opened up the Netflix queue, navigated to this 2010 (but only in limited release) movie, *Centurion*.

Starring Michael Fassbender as the Centurion of the title Quintus Dias, Andreas Wisniewski as Commander Gratus, Dave Legeno as Vortix, Axelle Carolyn as Aeron, Dominic West as General Titus Flavius Virilus, J.J. Feild as Thax, Lee Ross as Septus, David Morrissey as Bothos, Ulrich Thomsen as the Pict chieftain Gorlacon, Paul Freeman as Governor Julius Agricola, Bond girl Olga Kurylenko as Etain, Liam Cunningham as Brick, Noel Clarke as Macros, Dimitri Leonidas as Leonidas (is this considered to be type-casting?), Riz Ahmed as Tarak, and Imogen Poots as Arianne, this is a movie about betrayal, death, monomaniacal revenge, more betrayals, more deaths, and a whole lot of graphic gore in the year 117 A.D. at the furthest reaches of the Roman Empire. All of which leads to basically the same conclusion as the tag line in *Highlander*. "In the end, there can be only one."

Good points: Much of the scenery. The storyline is really not that bad: is basically Picts versus Romans in a long overland chase. The cinematography in places was very good.

Bad points: The writer and the director were the same person (Neil Marshall). This is not necessarily a bad thing in a lot of movies, but I think it was a negative in this case. Vanity projects like this can turn out decently enough, but the majority of them don't. This is <u>not</u> a movie for the squeamish. (Anna Sue kept looking up at just the wrong times.) The funeral pyre, to borrow a phrase from any one of the many cop shows on TV, must have "used an accelerant." Because wood just doesn't catch fire anywhere nearly that quickly, don't you know? The saddles on all of the horses had stirrups, a much later invention. (Think Norman invasion of England, not Roman invasion of England.) The several betrayals of comrades in arms.

Zero breasts. Eight gallons of blood. (I told you it was not a movie for the squeamish!) 411 dead bodies. Arrow fu. Spear fu. Flaming arrow fu. Axe fu. Thrown axe fu. Tree fu. Rolling fireball fu. Sling fu. Fisticuffs. Hand rolls. Heads roll. Waves roll. Picts roll. Romans roll. Gratuitous head butting. Gratuitous waterboarding torture. Gratuitous arrow through the eye. (Again, not for the squeamish!) Gratuitous tick. Gratuitous heads on spikes. Gratuitous graphic violence, complete with squelching sounds. A 97 on the Vomit Meter. Two stars. Da'ud Bob says "Did I mention that this was not a movie for the squeamish? Check it out!"
