There has been some discussion this last month regarding our social media policy. I summarized the *temporary policy* during the business meeting but I would like to restate it here for those that could not attend.



The temporary policy for Namron is:

• If you want to post a photo or video on an official site, of persons other than yourself, then we ask that you either clear that with or send it to myself, my social media deputy, or the baronial chronicler so that we can make sure all persons in that media are okay with having that posted.

• If you want to post a picture/video of yourself or your immediate family, I am personally not going to delete that. This resembles the sort of the common "practice" that others groups seem to follow.

• If the image does not have a person in it, you are free to post it as long as it is not violating copyright laws.

• If the image of the person is not easily identifiable (for example if they are in armor or you cannot clearly see their face), you are free to post it.

• If you are IN a photo or video and you do not wish to have that on official social media you can contact myself, the social media deputy, or the chronicler and we will remove it.

The primary concerns are that we want pictures and videos to be posted to our official social media presence, but not at the expense of someone who does not want their image posted. My social media deputy is working with kingdom deputy to clarify kingdom position in this matter. I am certain that soon this will all be resolved and I have no doubt that my social media deputy will seek to satisfy kingdom policy while managing our presence.

<u>The Arabian Night</u> Arts & Science Champi

Good Greetings, Artisans!

In selecting the Art & Sciences Champion of Namron, The Barony of Namron seeks to encourage artisans who are experienced as well as novice to display their crafted items in competition, keeping in mind that goals are to educate *and* to have fun. Written critique sheets may be used by Judges, and if so, will be given to the artisans for their considerations. The following are some guidelines offered for entering A&S Championship Competition, suggested by Namron's 2018 A&S Champion, Tessa of the Gardens.

1. Theme as announced by Their Excellencies is "Arabian Nights"

2. There is not a limit to item type, medium, mode, or method used, provided it might have existed.

3. Any Artisan may display up to two (2) entries, each of which would be judged independently.

4. The Ruling Nobility will determine how many or specifically who the Judges are to be.

Some possible scenarios of Judging Team:

- A. Their Excellencies;
- B. Laurels at event, using written critique forms – which may or may not include "Shadow Judges" such as Irises and/or other Artisans along with the Laurels, making constructive written remarks;
- C. Populace Favorite without written critique, determined by count of beads and thereby giving the Populace a reason to be involved in observations, then the Favorite to be considered by Their Excellencies in making Their decision for Champion.

5. We want newer participants without competition experience to feel welcomed to participate in A & S endeavors, and we do welcome participation if as a learning experience for you. If one cannot feel comfortable entering an A & S arena because the requirements are too exclusive, when might one ever?

HOWEVER, documentation is strongly encouraged. While a piece without documentation will not be turned away from display, an entry "with" primary and secondary resources researched is likely to score higher numbers than any entry that is not accompanied by documentation. A purpose of SCA is "education," yes?

A *bare minimal* documentation would be an index card naming the piece and listing the inspirational source, as has been traditional in several baronies before.

A more highly favored document would be a minimum of one page supplying research about the piece, method used, and listing the sources used.

6. Competition set-up place/time & pick-up time will be announced by the event planners.

7. The pass-along championship cloak and banner will be placed in the care of the next A&S Champion along with "bragging rights."

Personal gifts to the winning Artisan may be retained. The in-coming A&S Champion will be asked to select the FORMAT for the next Championship Competition, about one year hence.

<u> Vights Brewing Champi</u>

Bring Your Best – enter TWO (2) beer bottles of your best brew; beer, wine, mead, seriously your BEST brew. Judging will be popular choice by judges, chosen by Their Excellencies.

c Format for U

All fighters must present themselves and their consort for entry into the list.

<u>First Round</u>: **Swiss Five Tournament** with the prescribed weapons for each round being: sword and shield, two weapons, great weapons, six-foot slashing spears, and nine-foot spears. The highest ranked fighters will move on to the second round.

<u>Second Round</u>: Single elimination, best two out of three, bring your best tournament

The format will have five (5) rounds.

At the beginning of each round, fighter pairings would be announced by the herald. The combatants would then meet at the table of the list mistress where each would roll a special six-sided die. The die faces read single rapier/rapier and dagger/rapier and buckler/two rapiers/rapier and cloak/ a heraldic rose.

The combatants would then face one another with the roll of the die. The fighting style for the heraldic rose will be determined by the choice of Her Excellency or the List Mistress (however they choose to decide). A double kill would be refought once; a second consecutive double kill would count as a loss for both combatants.

After the round of five, the top four combatants would be paired in a best two-of-three semifinals. The winners would then face one another in the finals. Fighting styles for each round will be fighter's choice ("Bring your best"). During these rounds, double kills would be refought until a point has been won by a combatant.

1 C. All Purpose Flour	2 Tbsp. Fresh chives, coarsely chopped
½ tsp. salt or sea salt (¼ tsp if using salted	1 Tbsp. Fresh Thyme, coarsely chopped
butter)	1 Tbsp. Fresh Oregano, coarsely chopped
¼ tsp. black pepper (ground pepper of choice)	4 Tbsp cold butter, cut in to pieces
(When chopping herbs be careful not to	14 C. Sour Cream
bruise them)	Salt to Sprinkle

INSCRUCCIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 325°.
- 2. In a mixing bowl mix flour, salt, pepper, and herbs (careful not to bruise the herbs).
- 3. Add sour cream to mixing bowl mix until the dough looks like it has a crumb like texture.
- 4. Transfer to a lightly floured surface and divide into two halves. Roll each into a 10x12 sheet about 1/8th inch thick. Sprinkle with salt and roll dough lightly to press in the salt.
- 5. Cut into desired shape transfer to parchment lined baking sheet pierce each cracker with a fork. Bake for 12-14 minutes, just until brown and feel firm to the touch.
- 6. Cool crackers on rack (or plate) and enjoy with or without your favorite spread.

λ Fingerloop Braiding Droject For Multiple Braiders

Reported by HL Masina Da Ferrara (also known as Siriporn Peters)



This fingerloop braiding project is a collaborative project between local members in Norman, Oklahoma. The project was initiated by a group who attended a series of fingerloop braiding workshops in July 2019 at the Central Library in Norman, Oklahoma. The objectives are to promote fingerloop braiding methods and explore a design concept of multiple braiders. The main goal is to create a design prototype of a rainbow color strip lace or also known as an Iris ribbon (in Fig 1). This prototype is only a few inches long. It was created by Mistress Vigdis Gráfeldr (also known as Cynthia Teague), Baroness Annabelle Fitzsimmons (also known as Sheryl Epperson), HL Masina Da Ferrara (also known as Siriporn Peters), and Paul Moisant. This project was led by HL Masina (Fig 2-3). The 6 colors lace below was created on Tuesday, August 20 between 6:15 p.m. and 8:15 p.m.

A multiple persons braid, 21 loops for 3 persons or 6 hands. Each person holds 7 loops.

The directions consist of Tollemache 23 A brod lace party (T23) and Tollemache 21 An open lace of 7 bows (T21). The group started learning how to braid a 7-loop braid on August 13, 2019. They learned how to braid this complex braid by applying the directions from the 15th century manuscript as follows:

Tollemache 23 A brod lace party (T23) and Tollemache 21 An open lace of 7 bows (T21) (Fig 4). After that, two braiders worked together to achieve a two persons/bodies work, Tollemache 54 Lace ray (Fig 5).

Group discussions

Based on the group's observations, the multiple fingerloop braiding is fun and easier than braiding solo. They got a lot more done and they braided faster than braiding solo. The group members agree that a bi-color bow/loop is easier to work with and helps the braiders to check their move sets and spot a mistake. The movements for tightening the braid are intuitive. A single color bow/loop is much harder to braid. It requires a lot of concentration while braiding. However, the idea was tested and braided solo by using a single color per person as shown in Fig 6.

What is next?

These fingerloop braid prototypes will be displayed at the Ansteorra 40th Anniversary. HL Masina will teach a series of workshops again at this event. The multiple persons braid will be demonstrated. To join our braiding session for making this rainbow color lace during the Advanced Fingerloop Braiding workshop, you are required to have previous knowledge and skills of T21 and T23. The group would like to discuss how to set up a loop braiding guild in the kingdom in order to promote the multiple persons braiding methods and techniques in the near future. Óisby's Savory Toasced Cheese Recipe from Handout (aka Cheese Hoo)

1/4 CUP BUTTER

2 TBSP. WHOLE MILK

1/4 CUP CREAM CHEESE

1/4 TSP. WHITE PEPPER

1/4 lb. Brie or farmers cheese

Melt butter. Melt cream cheese in butter. Add milk. Cut up the farmer's cheese and stir it into the mixture over low heat. You may want to use a whisk to blend the two together, though a spoon will do. When you have a uniform, creamy sauce you are done. Serve over toast, put on toast and broil for 30 seconds to 1 minute, mix in (or serve over) things like asparagus, bacon, sauteed onions, etc.

Cut pieces of quick, fat, rich, well tasted cheese, (as the best of Brye, Cheshire, &c. or sharp thick Cream-Cheese) into a dish of thick beaten melted Butter, that hath served for Sparages or the like, or pease, or other boiled Sallet, or ragout of meat, or gravy of Mutton: and, if you will, Chop some of the Asparages among it, or slices of Gambon of Bacon, or fresh-collops, or Onions, or Sibboulets, or Anchovis, and set all this to melt upon a Chafing-dish of Coals, and stir all well together, to Incorporate them; and when all is of an equal consistence, strew some gross White-Pepper on it, and eat it with tosts or crusts of White-bread. Society Vocabulary Explained!

<u>General Terms, Part 1</u>

- <u>Anno Societatis</u> (abbreviated "A.S.") The dating system we use in the SCA (translates to "In the Year of the Society"). May 1, 1966 was the first day of the year A.S. I, and May 1st is "New Year's Day" for each Society year. The years are usually depicted in Roman numerals.
- <u>Arms</u> (or device) the heraldic emblem that identifies a person or entity.
- <u>Award of Arms</u> a Society-wide award given by the royalty. Recipients can use the title "Lord" or "Lady" before their names.
- <u>Arts and Sciences</u> crafts and skills of the Middle Ages/Renaissance which we research and practice in the SCA. Also referred to as "A & S".
- <u>Authorization</u> the process that fighters and fencers go through to be allowed to participate in combat.
- **Barony/Shire** types of SCA local chapters. Baronies are generally larger in size, and have a Baron and/or Baroness as their ceremonial heads. Sub-groups within a Barony's territory are known as Cantons, or in some areas, Ridings or Strongholds. All these groups are officially recognized in the SCA and are administered by a slate of officers.
- **Bardic Circle** an informal gathering for singing and storytelling. Anyone who attends is welcome to perform appropriate material, but you can just sit and listen if you prefer. A *bard* is a person who sings, tells stories, recites poetry, etc.
- <u>**Blue Card</u>** an SCA membership card printed on blue cardstock, indicating that the card holder has a signed waiver on file at the SCA offices.</u>
- <u>**Court**</u> a gathering where the King and Queen of a kingdom make announcements and present awards. Rulers of principalities hold Principality courts, and landed Barons and Baronesses hold Baronial courts.

Submiccius Award Recommendacions

With fall event season approaching, it is a great time to nominate people for awards. While awards are given by the Crown and the Baron and Baroness, they rely on the populace members to be their eyes and ears for who is deserving of recognition. So much of what is done in the SCA happens behind the scenes – people's service to the barony and kingdom, their arts and their other activities. Interested in submitting an award recommendation? Here's how!

General Libs

- Anyone can send in recommendations. The Baron and Baroness or Crown will take those nominations into account when they select award recipients. It is ok and encouraged to nominate your friends –you are going to know what they are involved with behind the scenes and are doing on a regular basis. The Crown and Baron and Baroness can't be everywhere and see everything so they need populace members to be their eyes and ears with regards to awards.
- Do you think someone is deserving of recognition, but don't know the appropriate award? Talk to more experienced members, people that already have the award or go online there are descriptions of all of the awards. Also, **don't assume someone has an award**. Check the baronial and kingdom order of precedence to see awards people have received. Often times someone will go years without getting an award just because people think they already have it.
- List additional people as references as well as events you know the nominee will be attending.
- Resubmit award recommendations after Coronation or when a new Baron and Baroness step up.

Baronial Awards

Namron has several baronial-level awards, including the Torsade, Argent Fleur, Ascia Rossa and the Rising Storm. The Torsade is given to those that improve the Barony through service and is represented by a 6-color ribbon braid. The Argent Fleur is given to those that enrich the culture of Namron through the arts and sciences and is represented by a blue and white ribbon braid. The Ascia Rossa is given to those that bring honor and glory to Namron through the marshallate activities and is represented by a red fighting axe with a black Namron storm on it. The Rising Storm is the Barony's youth service award, however it recognizes that service to the Barony can take many forms.

The Barony also has a polling order – The Order of the Heart of the Sable Storm. This is the only baronial level award that also includes an Award of Arms. Because of this it is signed by both the Baron and Baroness as well as the King and Queen. This award is given after years of service to the Barony. It is represented by a gold storm, typically worn as a pendant.

The final baronial-level award is the Kriegshelt. This is also a polling order. It is an award of great prestige, recognizing lifelong service to the Barony. It is represented by a silver storm, typically worn as a pendant.

Baronial award recommendations need to be emailed to the Baron and Baroness at <u>baron@namron.ansteorra.org</u> and <u>baroness@namron.ansteorra.org</u>. They need to be submitted several weeks before an event in order to give the Baron and Baroness time to decide and for the scribes to create the scrolls. kiuzdom Awards

The Kingdom has a variety of awards for arts and sciences, marshallate activities, service and more – available on both the adult and youth levels. Youth awards include the Rising Star (similar to a youth-level AoA), Aquila Aurea (youth marshallate activities), Lillium Aureum (youth arts and sciences), and the Lyra Aurea (youth service).

Adult awards are divided into several levels – non-armigerous, armigerous awards, grant, patent/peerage, and nobility.

- <u>Non-Armigerous</u>: Sable Falcon (chivalric combat), Queen's Rapier, King's Archer, Golden Bridle (equestrian arts), Golden Star (service to the Crown), Sable Flur (arts and sciences), Sable Sparrow (service), Amicitia (service by residents of foreign lands to the Kingdom of Ansteorra), White Scarf (rapier combat, non-armigerous for recipients after October 15, 2018), Lion (Exemplifying the ideals of the Society and serving as an inspiration to others), Rose (those who have served as Royal Consort)
- <u>Armigerous Level</u>: Award of Arms, Sable Comet (service to shire or other non-barony), Compass Rose (exceptional work w/ children), , Sable Crane (service to Kingdom), Sable Thistle (arts and sciences), Sable Talon (marshallate skill), King's Gauntlet (service to the King), Queen's Glove (service to the Queen)
- <u>Grant Level</u>: Grant of Arms, Star of Merit (service), White Scarf (rapier combat, grant level for recipients prior to October 15, 2018), Iris of Merit (arts and sciences), Arc d'Or (archery), Centurions of the Sable Star (chivalric combat), Golden Lance (equestrian arts), Blade of Merit (rapier combat), Court Barony
- <u>Patent/Peerage</u>: Patent of Arms, Pelican (service), Knight/Master of Arms (chivalric combat), Laurel (arts and sciences), Defense (rapier combat)
- <u>Nobility</u>: Barony if Fief (territorial Baron or Baroness), Viscounty (completing a reign as Sovereign or Consort of a Principality), County (completing a reign as Sovereign or Consort of a Kingdom), Duchy (completing two reigns as Sovereign or Consort of a Kingdom)

Kingdom level award recommendations are submitted online through a Google Form, which can be found <u>here</u>. Once the form has been submitted, it is best to also notify the Baron and Baroness as the Crown may contact them for more information on the individual being recommended.

Torsade

The Torsade is the Barony's service award and is presented by the Baron and Baroness of Namron. The colors of the Torsade represent past Baron & and Baronesses. This award is given when an individual has worked to help the Barony at a number of events throughout the year and in other activities that help to improve the Barony of Namron. It is made of six 1/4" ribbons – one each of red, black, white, yellow, blue and purple.

ARSENC Fluer

The Argent Fluer is an Arts and Sciences award and is presented by the Baron and Baroness of Namron. This award is given to those individuals who enrich the culture of Namron by their skill in the creation and or performance of period items. These skills can be for a wide range of activities and talent that cover all we see and do in the SCA. It is made of six 1/4" ribbons – three white and three blue.





6-Scraud Braid Inscructions*

From thetrendytreehouse.blogspot.com

- 1. Cut six equal pieces of ribbon, tie a knot at the end.
- 2. Pin to a cloth sofa or your pant leg. The knot can also be taped to a table.
- 3. Spread strands out.
- 4. Take the far left strand (red) and cross it to the *under* the orange.
- 5. Take the red strand and go over the yellow.
- 6. Take the far right strand (blue) and go over the purple.
- 7. Again with the blue, go under the green strand.
- 8. Again with the blue, go over the red strand.
- 9. Tighten and adjust the strands and repeat.

*Colors in the instructions match the graphic, not the actual award colors.

Tips

- An easy way to remember this: From the left...Under, Over; From the right...Over, Under, Over; Repeat!
- "Fold" the outside ribbons as you weave so that the strand will lay flat.
- Walmart tends to be the most reliable local source of all colors in the same size and appearance.
