

Honey Cakes

From Lady Ophelia Warde, in her continuing series of Norse recipes in honor of Their Excellencies, Baron Micolay and Baronowa Ulliana



Very easy to make (and addictive)

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 2 cups flour (you may use white flour or a mixture of whole meal/whole wheat and white)
- 1 tsp salt
- 3 tsp baking powder
- 5 Tbsp. honey
- 4 Tbsp. sweet (unsalted) butter
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup cream

Directions

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350°.
- 2. Sift together your flour, salt, and baking powder.
- 3. Dribble the honey over this dry mixture and toss so it becomes coated.
- 4. Cut butter into small pieces then drop over honey/flour mixture.

5. Using your fingertips, rub the honey and butter into the flour mixture so it is crumbly. (It will not be sticky –yet).

- 6. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs into the cream.
- 7. Add wet ingredients into butter crumbles and stir. (It will be sticky now.)
- 8. Turn out onto generously floured board, sprinkle with more flour, and pat to about $\frac{1}{2}$ " $-\frac{3}{4}$ " thickness.
- 9. Using a drinking glass, cut into rounds, and lay on parchment-paper lined baking sheet.
- 10. Bake for 12-15 minutes, until light golden and firm.

Enjoy with butter, jam, or more honey.

Makes 7 to 14, depending on your drinking glass. The glass I use is big.

Today we are blessed with *baking powder*, that Victorian combination of baking soda, cream of tartar, and cornstarch, which makes our cakes rise. Baking powder was created by British chemist Alfred Bird in 1843.

Prior to this now common household staple, people used "ash water" (water in which the ashes of hardwood trees had been soaked). Hardwood ash contains sodium & potassium carbonate, sodium & potassium chloride, and calcium carbonate.

The strained water was added to quick breads such as cakes and biscuits to allow them to rise. The strained ashes could also be dried, ground down, and used in a powdered form.

Ashes were used for many other things such as scouring and cleaning, for instance. Potassium carbonate is also known as *potash*, an alkali, and is naturally slippery or "soapy". When wet, ashes provide both the mild grit to scour, and the soapy quality of breaking down residual fats on cookware.

You can find The Historian's Handbook, written by Mistress Annes (Darlene Burns), teaching new Group Historians how to get started.


You can find a history of the early days of our Kingdom written by Mistress Annes.



Oid you knom?

In the medieval era, New Year's Day wasn't generally celebrated on January 1st. In some places, January 1st was selected to signal the beginning of the New Year after Roman law was revived, but it wasn't standard. In fact, many New Year's celebrations were held on March 25th, The Feast of the Annunciation. In some places, like Venice, the New Year began on March 1st, and in others, it began on Christmas or Easter. The Anglo-Saxons celebrated December 25th as the New Year, but this switched to March 25th in the later Middle Ages, and then to January 1st in the 18th century.

What was generally celebrated on January 1st was The Feast of Fools, a popular festival which originated in Northern France. It was a day where the tables were turned and the lower classes dressed up and poked fun at the upper classes, much like the Pagan Roman festival of Saturnalia, where slaves were able to to speak freely, criticize their masters without punishment, and enjoyed a feast. During the Feast of Fools, there was plenty of cross dressing, gambling, drinking, and risqué behaviour. Naturally, this didn't sit well with the Church and after repeated pressure and regulation attempts by ecclesiastic officials, the tradition petered out in the sixteenth century.

Greek Bread

From the hearth of Lady Hildegard Folkward

Ingredients

4 C. Bread flour

11/3 C. water

4 tsp Active Bread Yeast

4 tsp Salt

4 TBSP garlic (roasted is best but fresh will work can also use dried just reconstitute in water for about 5 minutes)

3 ½ TBSP Kalamata Olives rough chopped

2 tsp Oregano



Steps

- 1. Preheat oven to 475°F
- 2. In a large mixing bowl or stand mixer bowl add water first then stir in flour and yeast (if using a stand mixer keep on lowest setting) stir for one minute then add salt (we add salt later so we don't kill the yeast). Work until you have a dough like consistency then fold in garlic, olives, and oregano (if using a mixer add in the above ingredients before pouring dough from the bowl). Make sure ingredients are folded in well do not knead just fold in.
- 3. Lightly flour a large bowl, put dough in the bowl, cover with cling wrap or a towel and proof for 45 minutes.
- 4. Once done proofing put dough on a lightly floured surface and shape or you can put into an oiled bread pan proof again for 45 minutes uncovered.
- 5. Put bread in the oven preheated to 475°F for 15 minutes open oven door for 20 seconds and cook for an additional 10 minutes.
- 6. Serve with your favorite Greek oil and spices or make a great sandwich enjoy.




