



Lavender-scenced Pudding

From Lady Ophelia Warde, in her continuing series of Norse recipes in honor of





A delightful and rich soufflé-like pudding, redolent of lavender. Impressive and delicious, a sweet memory of Summer any time of year.

Oven to 350 F/ 180C/ Gas Mark 4

Remember: allow three hours for the lavender to steep in the milk before making

Ingredients

- 1 cup whole milk
- 2 Tbsp. dried lavender flowers, if possible from the garden of someone you love
- ¼ cup flour
- 6 Tbsp. honey
- 1 Tbsp. melted butter
- 3 eggs separated

Directions

- 1. Butter the inside of six 6 oz ramekins and dust lightly with flour.
- 2. Pour the milk into a small saucepan and add the lavender flowers.
- 3. Bring to a simmer, stirring, and turn off the heat and allow the lavender to steep in the milk at room temperature for three hours.
- 4. Strain, discarding the lavender, but saving the milk.
- 5. Combine 2 Tbsp. of the honey with the melted butter, and stir into the flour.
- 6. In another bowl, whisk the egg yolks and strained milk together.
- 7. Add the honey butter/flour mixture to the egg/milk mixture and whisk until
- 8. Beat the egg whites at medium speed until soft peaks form, and then add the remaining 4 Tbsp. honey in increments, increasing speed to high until the whites form stiff peaks.
- 9. Take about a third of the beaten whites and stir them into the egg yolk/milk/flour mixture, and then add the rest of the egg whites, gently folding in.
- 10. Pour into prepared ramekins so they are about ¾ full, and set on a baking sheet.
- 11. Place into preheated oven. Bake for 15 -20 minutes, or until risen high and golden brown.
- 12. Allow to rest on a rack for a few minutes before serving warm.





Woad: A free-growing herbaceous perennial plant, its leaves used for its astringent, antiseptic, and blood-staunching properties, and to produce the color blue for fabric dying.


