



# From the Minister of Children

#### Greetings to the Amazing Populace of Namron!

Happy June!

Summer is here. With summer and warmer weather, comes lots of outdoor fun and games. Did you know many of the games with play have a long history, different names, and some different variations? Let's take a look at a few.


Hopscotch was a war exercise for Romans. Soldiers had to hop or run across a 100ft grid in full armor to reach the other side. (Sounds similar to football players and other athletes these days who run though those tires or rope courses for practice.) Can you imagine running or hopping with an extra 50lbs or so on you? The word Hopscotch comes from hopping, obviously, and scotch was for scratch, because kids would scratch 10 squares in the dirt to create their grid. Now we just use chalk to draw our game. Should we call it hopchalk now?

Jack's is another game that has a history. It also had another name. Today we have the Jack's we know and a bouncy ball. But many centuries ago, they had knuckle, wrist, and ankle bones of sheep. That is where the game got its original name, Knucklebones. The game was also played a bit differently. They would throw the bones up and try to catch them either with their palms or the back of their hands or any other difficult way to make the game fun or more challenging. Before bouncy balls were ever a thing, children would use various things as the ball, like an apricot seed for example.

Other games, or variants, that children play today that have a long history are; Marbles, Capture the Flag, Tetherball, Blindmans Bluff, Red Rover, London Bridge is Falling Down, Croquet, Double Dutch, and many more. Some were played by adults even. So remember, while you are out there playing some of these games, you are taking part of history too. Grown ups, these games are for you too. This month's activity is a fun one. Pool noodles are aplenty right now and you can get them cheap. You can just with them or even make swords! So here's an easy DIY to make your own sword.

Pool Noodle Sword

Materials (for one sword): 1/2 a pool noodle duct tape circle of craft foam about 1 inch wider than the pool noodle one foam strip (about 1 and 1/2 inches wide and 6 inches long)



Tape the strip of foam to the bottom of one end of the pool noodle with the duct tape. Next tape the other end of the foam up higher on the pool noodle. Tape it so that the foam piece makes a slight bump/curve off of the noodle. (To make a handle.)



Use a knife/exacto knife and cut an "X" into the middle of the foam circle. Don't make the edges of the "X" go too close to the edges of the circle.



Slide the circle over the top of the pool noodle (the end opposite the handle) and slide it down so it rests on top of the handle. You can tape above it.



That's it, the pool noodle sword is complete! I'm sure you have some kiddos who would love it too!



destruction of his people and get them out one way or another out of England. This massacre included not only men but also women and children! No one can be sure how many Danes died that day. What is known is that Sweyn's sister Gunhilde and her husband were killed. When Sweyn discovered his sister and her husband were among those killed that day, he swore to get revenge. This great revenge led to many attacks and skirmishes along the English coast and eventually a battle for the conquest of England!

Ten years of fighting, rampaging and pillaging, terrified King Aethelred paid another Danegeld but Sweyn would not be swayed! King Aethelred was terrified and fled England in exile to his wife's homeland of Normandy. I will let people know when we can start accepting payments again so that we can get the many submissions turned.



## From the Treasurer

Greetings from the Exchequer.

Our current bank ledger balance is \$8129.10. While Spring Coronation was postponed, and we did not end up hosting it, we had incurred some expenses for it. Some of those were offset by people who had pre-paid and donated their site fee rather than receiving a refund, so it was a net loss of \$116.69. We will be receiving a refund of the \$1275.00 we had paid for the site, so that is not included in the loss. Beltane was a virtual event, but we did do some prizes, so there was a net loss of \$142.87, after we receive the \$600.00 site fee back. Those refunds will bring our balance up to \$10,004.10
