



Summer is officially here! So too are soaring temperatures, so be sure to stay well hydrated whether you are doing SCA things, working outside, or just enjoying the sunshine!

The Kingdom Earl Marshal has initiated a plan to resume marshal activities. If you haven't had a chance to familiarize yourself with it yet, it is fairly involved, heavily researched, and data driven. The details can be found here:

Our Barony was asked to hold a pilot practice to ensure that all the necessary precautions would be workable, and that practice seemed to work well. We have since had one more additional armored practice which also went well.

- 1. No one is required, or expected to come to practice if they feel it is unsafe.
- 2. Everyone who does come to one of the marshal practices must follow all of the new safety guidelines put into effect. This includes wearing PPE, following sanitation procedures, maintaining social distancing, and limiting spectators.

While the marshal activities have a plan to reopen practices, no other activities are currently allowed by the Kingdom Seneschal.

We can only assume this will be changing sometime in the future. When it does, please be courteous and follow any new requirements that Kingdom sets out.

We are looking for ideas for fun virtual activities we can do as a group. July's populace meeting will feature Populace Meeting Bingo. If you have fun ideas to add to our online meetings, let us know.

We are also trying to think of some group baronial projects that could be coordinated and divided up so they are workable in individual households, but will come together to benefit the barony. If you have ideas for this, let us know as well!



Sourdough Bread

Sourdough is one way bread was made in the middle ages. It collects and utilizes yeast that is naturally occurring in our environment instead of relying on store-bought yeast packets. Are you interested in making your own sourdough starter? Here are instructions from CooksIllustrated.com for a "quarantiny" starter. This version differs from a traditional sourdough starter in that it conserves flour because less is discarded at each feeding. The link provided has more information on the quarantiny starter, as well as troubleshooting FAQs, how to scale up your starter when you are ready to bake, and some recipes utilizing both the starter and the discards.

I have two starters in the works – a half-and-half mixture of all-purpose and bread flours and a half-and-half mixture of whole wheat and rye flours. Next month I will share a couple of recipes and hopefully be able to try them out and share my results!



Quarantiny Sourdough Starter

"Ingredients & Equipment:

2 small, lidded containers, such as 4-ounce mason jars

1 larger, lidded container, such as a 16-ounce mason jar

About 3 cups of white flour (or, better yet, an equal-weights mixture of white flour and whole-wheat or rye)

Water (filtered or bottled if possible)

The Start (day 1):

Using spoon, mix 10 grams (4 teaspoons) of your flour or flour mixture and 10 to 15 grams (2–3 teaspoons) of lukewarm (75F) water in small container (mixture should resemble thick muffin batter). Cover and let sit at warm room temperature (70 to 80 degrees) until bubbly and fragrant—even pungent—24 to 72 hours.

Check your jar every 24 hours for activity. When it's woken up, it should be bubbly and wet-looking, and will likely have a pungent, even offensive aroma (not to worry, this is totally normal—if it smells at all, it won't usually smell good, at least not until it's close to being mature). If it isn't active yet, put it back in its warm spot and check again in another day or so.

When it's active:

In your second small container, place 10 grams (4 teaspoons) of your flour or flour mixture, 10 to 15 grams (2–3 teaspoons) of lukewarm (75F) water, and 10 grams (2 teaspoons) of the previous batch until uniform. Cover and let sit at warm room temperature for 24 hours. Place the leftovers from the previous batch in the fridge as a backup.

Repeat this feeding (or "refreshment") procedure every 24 hours, discarding the contents of the backup jar, cleaning it out thoroughly, and using it to store that day's new culture. (That day's old culture then becomes the new refrigerated backup. This way you go back and forth between the two small jars.) Over time the look and smell of the culture will evolve, and it will likely get quite quiet. This throws a lot of people off, since they think it should look bubbly and smell fragrant the whole time. It likely will not; do not worry about this, just repeat as directed.

When it gets really active:

Somewhere between 7 and 14 days after the first refreshment, your nascent starter should start getting very active, meaning it is bubbly and fragrant after 12 hours or less, and it starts to smell yeasty or bread-like. If so, start refreshing it every 12 hours instead of every 24. (Do not jump the gun here—if it takes longer than 12 hours, stick to once-daily refreshments.)

You should also at this point begin collecting the contents of the backup jars in the third, larger jar, rather than tossing them out. Seal and store this jar in the fridge next to each day's backup. This is your "sourdough discard", which can be used in recipes once you have collected enough (at least 1/2 cup). Don't start collecting discard until it smells pleasant, however. "



Enjoy these mazes and how to draw a castle.






