



Practices and meetings continue to be restricted. Your Marshals will share information when practices are authorized. Covid-19 measures (masks, distancing, etc.) remain in effect.



September 22nd is observed as Hobbit Day thanks to J. R. R.

Tolkien's book *The Hobbit*. The book starts by celebrating the birthdays of two characters, Bilbo and Frodo Baggins, on September 22nd. While Tolkien's book is fictional, he does draw some inspiration from the Middle Ages.

Every good hobbit celebration involves food. Here are two family friendly medieval recipes that would also fit right in the world of Bilbo and Frodo.

boney Cakes

Ingredients

- 2 cups flour (you may use white flour or a half and half mixture of whole wheat and white)
- 1 tsp salt
- 3 tsp baking powder
- 5 Tbsp honey
- 4 Tbsp sweet (unsalted) butter
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup cream

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Sift together the flour, salt, and baking powder. Dribble the tablespoons of honey over this, then drop in the butter, cut into small pieces. Toss so that the honey is covered by the flour mixture, then using your fingertips, rub the honey-butter into the flour so it is crumbly. (It will not be sticky – yet). Beat the eggs into the cream, and add to bowl; stir. (It will be sticky now.) Turn out onto generously floured board, sprinkle with more flour, and pat to about $\frac{1}{2}$ " – $\frac{3}{4}$ " thickness. Using a drinking glass, cut into rounds, and lay on parchment–paper lined baking sheet. Bake for 12–15 minutes, until light golden and firm. Enjoy with butter, jam, or more honey.

Makes 7 to 14, depending on your drinking glass. Mine is big.



Mushroom Tarc

Ingredients

- 1-2 lbs. Mushrooms
- 1-2 cups Swiss cheese
- 1-2 tsp. Powder Fine (a medieval spice blend, see recipe below)
 - Pie Crust

Directions

Sauté mushrooms in small amount of oil to cook the mushrooms and release their water. Drain and cool. Mix with the spice powder and cheese place into the pie crust and bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes until done.

Douder Fine (A MEDIEVAL SPICE BLEND)

Spice blends would vary by region and even the person making them. This is one interpretation of Powder Fine.

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons of ginger
- 11/2 tablespoons of cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon cloves
- Optional items:
- o 1 teaspoon of any or several of the following: bay leaf (ground), coriander, galangal, grains of paradise, long pepper, mace, nutmeg, pepper.
 - o Pinch of saffron
 - o 2 tablespoons of sugar

Directions

Grind all separately (or buy ground), then mix.
