Words from Their Sable Winged Excellencies

Buongiorno onto all,

Holiday greetings to one & all in the Barony of Raven's Fort! We hope this missive finds everyone well. Be safe as you travel to other lands for Yule's, events or practices. It seems that we will have a brief respite from traveling this coming month but had a wonderful time at Bordermarch, the land of our cousins.

We have recently returned to our lands from a memorable weekend at Bordermarch where artisans, warriors and merchants gathered to prepare for Gulf War in March 2012. Their Royal Majesties Aaron & Amelot were joined by Their Majesties of Gleann Abhann. The Gleann Abhann's artisans competed with Ansteorra's artisans as did the honorable warriors from both kingdoms.

A great fighting practice, including Equestrian, and Artistic competition was held. HE Giovanna supported our troops and new people alike with the hospitality of foods and friendship under the Barony's list field pavilion. HE Pasquale, with the assistance of many, was authorized as a combat archer. He also has been allowed to become a Deputy Marshall for Chivalric in Raven's Fort with much thanks to HE Brian on many counts.

While HE Pace was being evaluated on the field as to his ability to fight safely as an archer, he witnessed Lord Egan stop a challenge to our left flank. All Lord Egan did was to slay THREE Gleann Abhann heavies with perhaps not more blows than men he bested. In the ravine battle, Lord Egan fought until exhaustion took him from the field. While fighting, he was joined by Lord Kaleb the Insane, whose skill with a spear is legendary. Centurion Michael's prowess and skill as a General reflected the Crown's wisdom in appointing him to such a high rank. Sir Kief was in the fray, but had to face Ansteorra's might, as his contingent was asked to help fill Gleann Abhann's ranks. HE Brian not only took the field but he also competed in the A &S competitions with very nice leather gauntlets. Lord Lemoine also entered the A & S with his study of pigment painting on several mediums. He was joined by Lady Rosalia, proud owner of a new helm. The last we saw Lord Egan he was being whisked away and attended to by Lady Runa in her chariot.

Back to the Ravine battle, where narrow was the ravine and steep were its sides. Our archers, standing elbow to elbow, unleashed a rain of death that allowed our spear men /women, inspired and lead by our beautiful Queen Amelot to charge forward. General Centurion Michael led all from the front, to unleash his chivalric brothers upon those who kept coming. HE Pace encourages any who can, to consider taking up a bow or crossbow, please do so. The battle, when such a balance of missile, heavy, and spear persons are utilized as they were this day, leaves no doubt as to the battles' outcome. Rapier competitions were also held but we haven't any news concerning it, Bardic or Equestrian results.

In evening court, Mirabelis was awarded the Kingdom's 'Golden Bridle' award. The Vivat from her presentation must still be ringing in her ears. HE Pace got his Bordermarch's 'Shaky Knees' award for his first kill at BAM. Berengaria assisted with the equestrian competition by scoring the runs and assisting in the general activities. Mirabelis was seen atop a horse many a time during the day. Arabella, who is working on her Chirurgeon authorization, worked with Lady Caley on several injuries in the ravine battle. Once again, Mistress Shanahan gave sustenance and shared her great knowledge to Emmit and Michelangelo from Raven's Guild and several people on the list field. Mistress Jalali gave a class on heraldry and our own Camerlingo, Herr Detlef, heralded Court for HE Santiago of Bordermarch. Several of our Barony sat gate including HE Giovanna, HE Pace, Mistress Jalali, Mistress Nerak, and Lady Mirabelis. Mistress Jalali also helped with the brewing competition as well. HE Elizabeth was truly missed as she was still in the hospital recovering from several surgeries on her back.

After court, we played drums, attempted dancing and depending on age, enjoyed awesome meads. Cheer was seen dancing beautifully in the Hafla we attended that evening and enjoying herself.

Our Baronial camp was home to eleven people and two 'war dogs' in all. Much laughter was heard from our camp and those all around as the weekend progressed. In all, it was a fantastic event with the Raven being well represented.

A special thank you's to Lord Egan, Thomas, Emmit Red Britches and Michelangelo for their help in setting up and taking down camp and the list field pavilion. Their friendship and help proved a great reminder that our Barony thrives to enrich our Baronial health and welfare.

Our Yule will be Saturday, December 10, 2011. Yes, the drought will perhaps prevent us from having outdoor fires, but our inside hearth will be burning. We have invited all who may, attend our Raven's Fort Yule. We hope to see you there on Dec. 10 at Ridgetop Farm. Please call us for directions.

Newcomer's Guide to the Kilt in the SCA: Part IV

(N.B. This article was originally an email to a newcomer who expressed some interest about kilts. After finishing it, I realized that I hadn't seen this type of information all compiled in one place, so I wrote this article and posted it to my live journal, where it received pretty positive reviews. Some revisions of the original have been made since commenter's have brought some errors to my attention.)

Now let me talk about how to wear a great kilt. The original great kilt was made from a piece of plaid that was woven on a loom about 30-35 inches wide. It would be made about 9 yards long. This would then be cut in half so that you had two sections about 4 1/2 yards long. These would be sewn together along the long edge, so that you finished with a piece of material about 4 1/2 yards long and about 60-70 inches wide. There are guides on how to fold this material into a kilt. What they have in common is that you pleat the kilt in the middle, leaving two un-pleated sections on each end that is about the width of your hips. This is belted around you (various different techniques here) so that the un-pleated aprons are overlapping in front, left over right. The kilt should be belted so that when you get on your knees the hem of the "skirt" just brushes the floor. This will leave a large amount of kilt flowing over the belt, and this is the drape that you arrange around yourself. This is where the variation comes in, as there are as many ways to arrange this drape as there are people wearing it. I will include some links with suggestions, but really, anything you do with it that makes it comfortable and look good are okay.

I bought my latest kilt from the Celtic Croft. They have pretty reasonable prices, but any kilt you buy is going to be expensive, even for the thin wool versions. If I remember right I spent about \$300 on it... but I find it was worth it because it feels so much more period and right than my previous cotton kilt. Also, Celtic Croft offers a cheat, in that they will sew the pleats into your kilt for you along with a waist band for about an extra \$50. While this isn't period, it makes your getting-dressed time about 15 minutes instead of about 30-60 minutes. They also have a couple good history pages. http://www.kilts-n-stuff.com/

More options for vendors can be found on the kilt-centric forum at X Marks the Scot (http://www.xmarksthescot.com/forum), though the forums themselves focus on the kilt as it's worn in the modern era.

I will say that I wished I had gotten mine wider. It is 60 inches wide, and when belted and folded comfortably, I cannot get it to do the "hood" configuration that is so useful in cold weather. Next time I get or make one I will make sure that it is wide enough that it can go from the back of my knees, over my head and down to my chin or neck. After belting, this width will probably be able to hood to about my eyebrows.

Also, if you are planning to fight, you might take a look at a couple more links. Scots in period didn't fight in their kilts unless it was surprise combat on the street or some other special circumstance. They definitely didn't go into battle that way. Traditionally in our period they would go into battle wearing their leines. www.MyArmoury.com has some excellent articles, and can show an accurate depiction of different styles of Scottish dress and armor in this link: http://www.myarmoury.com/feature_armies_scots.html

You might notice in the third picture down the page (depicting different late eras of fighting Scot) the man labeled (b) is wearing a leine, with a brat in the Irish style and ghillie brogues. Unfortunately, all the kilted fighters pictured are out-of-period.

I hope this has answered your questions about wearing a kilt. If not, let me know, especially if you find something here that is inaccurate, as some of my information was picked up second-hand, or word-of-mouth. If you find a primary source let me know, as I am always looking to upgrade my kit.
