How to...

How to Improve your Garb by HL Marie de Meaux

I am often asked by newcomers on how they can improve their clothing on a budget. I have been told that buying trim is not always an option. This really is a question that can be applied to anyone who plays.

When looking at simple designs, there are several techniques that can be used to add a pop of color. I will cover a few techniques in this article. However, these should just be a beginning of ideas to help someone looking to be creative.

One simple way to do this is the use the same type of fabric on the cuffs and hem of your tunic in a different color from the main fabric. Then, to save a little money I like to do a reverse tunic. What I mean by that is to use the color previously used as trim to make the main body of a second tunic and use the scraps/leftovers of the earlier tunic as trim. Additionally, I save the fabric to make linen or wool buttons that I can further embellish a tunic or dress.

Another way is to use fabric paint and wooden stamps to line the edges of the tunic. Using this technique, it is important to heat seal the paint to preserve the pattern. I like to use a lighter color on the edges of the fabric or use scraps of fabric that I can paint to make my own trim.

Speaking of trim, learning to weave is a wonderful way to enhance a tunic or dress. The woven straps can also be used as belts or for purses. This allows you to really play with the width and design. The two main types of weaving that I would recommend are inkle and card.

Lastly, I would like to explain seam embellishments/seam treatments. This can be a simple stitch that you use along the seams of your clothing or even over the seams of your clothing. Using contrasting threads, you can really make a piece stand out. Threads can be as inexpensive as yarn or cotton.
