Tre-1600 Mesoamerican and South American Sustenance Crops That You Can Grow in Vindheim

When discussing pre-1600 gardens and agriculture, there is a tendency to focus on European gardens, however people all over the world were cultivating a wide assortment of native crops for food, fiber, building supplies, and animal feed. If you have lived in Vindheim for any length of time, you will be familiar with both eating and growing many of the crops enjoyed throughout Mesoamerica and South America. Most of the foods grow well in our principality and still feature heavily in local cuisine.

My lord and I are starting a small garden at our home this year featuring some of these foods, and we cordially invite you to visit during the summer if you find yourself in the heart of Namron. Additionally, I have curated a selection of seeds to share if you would like to plant your own this year. Currently, 25 packets are available. Contact me by email at kolfinnaegilsdottir@gmail.com or by Facebook (Kara Hoyle) and I will gladly mail you a small packet.

Teosinte, *Zea mays parvaglumis*, is widely regarded as the predecessor to modern corn. It still grows in the wild throughout Mexico, and favors a long growing season. Plant in April, in well-draining sandy loam, and it will self-seed in subsequent years after a light tilling of the soil. The plants are tall, reaching six feet or more. Tying or staking can help reduce breakage during high winds. Mature plants will produce tassels, like modern corn, and then seed heads. These heads are small, with hard-shelled seeds. Thousands of years of careful cultivation brought us the large heads of thin-shelled seeds that we now enjoy as corn/maize. Your harvest will feed many types of birds and provide cover for small animals like rabbits. Teosinte may also attract deer, if that is a consideration for your growing space. The plants can also be used as excellent fodder and silage.

Tomato, Solanum lycopersicum, was introduced to Europe in the 16th century by the Spanish, who first tasted the fruit during contact with the Nahua peoples. Tomatoes had already been in cultivation for roughly seventeen centuries in Mesoamerica, and a wide variety of sizes, shapes, and colors were eaten. To simulate the earliest known types of tomatoes in your garden, select small grape or pear tomatoes of an indeterminate (vining) variety.

Quinoa, *Chenopodium quinoa*, is native to mountainous areas of South America. Mature plants reach about four feet in height in a dry climate, but substantial rainfall can double that. Plant seeds in the spring, after the last frost, in well-draining loamy soil and provide consistent watering until they sprout. Thin sprouts to 18" between plants for best growth. As a high altitude, cool weather plant, they will benefit from afternoon shade in Vindheim. Mulch well and water consistently, allowing to dry slightly between waterings. To harvest, wait until the leaves drop from the plant. Gather the seed heads, winnow debris with a fan, and spread the seeds out on mesh or another aerated surface to dry.

Chia, Salvia hispanica, is native to Mexico and Guatemala, and is a member of the mint family. Sow seeds in your garden in the fall. Provide light watering daily until the seeds sprout. Chia is tolerant of soil types from sandy to clay, and requires good drainage. The plants boast bell-shaped blue to purple flowers that are visited by pollinators. Seeds form just below the flowers. A mature plant can reach five feet in height. Chia is a self-sowing annual and can spread enthusiastically, like other mints. Its native range is gardening zones 8-11, but with careful selection of location, you can grow it throughout Vindheim.



Bean, *Phaseolus vulgaris*. The runner bean, which grows on vines, was but one of many beans that originated in the Americas. Beans were, and still are, an important part of local cuisines and are prepared in numerous ways. Check your favorite seed catalog and try growing a couple of varieties that catch your eye. There are some beautiful beans available, and they grow easily in Vindheim!

Squash, *Curcurbita pepo*, includes pumpkins, summer squash, and ornamental squash. The oldest known pumpkin seeds are nearly 9,000 years old, and pumpkins have been cultivated for 7–8,000 years. Colors varied by region, from green to orange. Squash can require a significant amount of space in which to grow, but can also be trellised in smaller spaces.

Peanut, Arachis hypogaea. Found in Peruvian tombs from 3500 years ago, peanuts have become a staple crop worldwide. They grow readily in warm climates, and are nitrogen fixers that help improve soil quality. Light, sandy loam and warm sunny weather, with moderate watering is all you need to grow your own peanuts. Plant raw, shelled peanuts after the threat of frost is past (seedlings can be started indoors), and mulch young plants.



Amaranth, Amaranthus cruentus, A.hypochondriacus, and A.caudatus are the varieties grown for seed harvest. Several other varieties with smaller seed heads are grown as ornamentals. Particularly striking is the Love Lies Bleeding variety. Amaranth is frequently found in "ancient grain" blends, has a high protein content, and contains all nine essential amino acids. Plants can reach over eight feet in height. Due to its carbon fixing prowess, amaranth can succeed in dry, hot climates. Amaranth can also be used for dyeing.



Chile/Pepper, Capsicum annuum. Whether you like them sweet or scorching, peppers have been a staple of cuisine in the southern Americas for thousands of years. They enjoy the same care and conditions as tomatoes. Try a few different varieties until you find your favorites to grow and eat!

Epazote, *Chenopodium ambrosioide*s, can be used in tea, but most commonly serves as an important herb for its flavor. Epazote has carminative properties, so it is frequently used in cooking bean-based dishes. Soak seeds in water before planting in well drained soil, in full sun. *Epazote is not recommended for consumption by small children or pregnant persons, as it is toxic in large quantities.

Potato, Solanum tuberosum. Potatoes were first domesticated in the Andes at least 10,000 years ago, and have been a cornerstone of various cuisines ever since. They are one of the most important food crops in the world today. The early varieties were small like modern fingerling potatoes. Modern gardening offers numerous ways to grow them—in the ground, in straw bales, in trash cans, in specially constructed containers, and more. Select the method that is right for your space and grow a bushel or two of this ancient sustenance crop!



Sweet potatoes, *Ipomoea batatas*, were cultivated approximately 5,000 years ago. Interestingly, they traveled across the Pacific Ocean first to Polynesian islands, whereas most foods first traversed the Atlantic. Typically propagated by stem or root cuttings, sweet potatoes can also be started with "slips," which are shoots from a mature sweet potato. They do not tolerate cold, so plant in warm soil after all danger of frost has passed. Mulch young vines well and prevent them from sending new roots into the ground to keep energy focused on growing the underground tubers.



Battlevores and Shuttlecocks Apevieval Barminton in Your Backyarv

The game that we know modernly as badminton has been played for roughly 2,000 years, in all corners of the earth, with varied materials and rules. The medieval European battledore was typically a wooden paddle rather than the racket that came into use in later centuries. The shuttlecock was made by sticking feathers into a piece of cork.

Making a set is quick and easy! All of the parts can be purchased online, or found at your local craft store. The wooden paddle for a battledore may not be as readily available, but it's a common item for sorority paddles, or you may be able to find the type used for pottery. The game can be played indoors or out, and makes a great addition to your camping kit! If you have tools and some scrap lumber, you can cut out your own battledores using the included template. You'll need two battledores, one shuttlecock, and two players for a rousing challenge. Simply face off, hit the shuttlecock back and forth, and try to keep it from hitting the ground. And have fun!

Making a "Medieval Badminton Set"

To make a shufflecork, you will need a cork and 6-8 duck feathers. A standard wine cork, a 49 tapored cork, or a 112" ball cork will work, to. Feel free to saloctitute a similar size i weight feather of a different type.

Using an awl, make pilot holes in one end of the cork (or around the "equator" if wring a round core") for the feathers. Insert the Geathers and trim evenly, if desired.

Players hit the shuttle cock back and forth using the battledones, trying not to let the shuttle cock hit the ground. No net was used.



Versions of battledone and shuttlecock first appeared around 2,000 years ago.

Many players kept records of their longest hit streaks in the early 19th century.
