Intro to the Aethelmearc Forestry Guilo Challenge

Greetings to Ansteorra, my name is Thorgeir Bjornsson and I wanted to share information about a Challenge that occurs in another Kingdom, Aethelmearc. The challenge Aethelmearc Forestry Guild Challenge. Within the Kingdom of Ansteorra there has been a growing interest in Farm, Field and Forestry within Arts and Sciences. Recently a special edition of our Blackstar was published about this growing trend. This article will be just about the Aethelmearc Forestry Guild Challenge which is open to those from outside of the Kingdom.

I hope to encourage more people to investigate this growing field. This would also be considered experimental archaeology. You can research period gear, recreating them and testing them in the real world. Those turn shoes you made, let's see how they handle under pressure. Will the pack basket you made actually work in the field. In the SCA we make lots of stuff, but have we really tested the items we make.

I am using the post from their Facebook Guild page and the post was from Alfrun Ketta (MKA Jenn Culler). I apologize for not being able to do proper accents over the A and U in her name yet. I will also be drawing from the comments on the ideas for the next challenge that have been discussed in the comments. The idea and many of the challenges they used came from Atlantia's Guild; who used it as a why to keep busy during the pandemic. The current challenge is currently closed but planning is already happening for the next year with a start of September 2025. The challenge is a lot more than just making a few A&S items and calling it good like several challenges that have been done before. This one includes focus areas of Research & Recreation, Education, Safety, Camping, Hiking, Voyaging, Bushcraft, Firecraft/Outdoor cooking, and environmental Stewardship. I will be presenting the current items for each focus area and then discuss the new ideas at the end.

The Rules for the current challenge are Item must be verified by an officer, photo, video or document attachment and are also encouraged to share your work with the Guild Facebook page. Activates may be completed from September5, 2024 to July 25, 2025; so the next challenge will start on September 5, 2025. Points may only be earned once for each activity while some items in different categories may be combined. Example you can't stack a backpacking trip with a basic camping trip, but a second backpacking trip would count. You can stack items like Building a fire, cooking a meal on a camping trip. Completion of points can earn badge or token; the current points will be listed on new challenge. It is not a competition, it is for fun, education and to encourage forester activity and also encouraged to plan activities together such as, Hiking, camping, classes and so forth.

For Research and Recreation, you get points based on activities certain activities some of which are repeatable. This area is where you see a wide range of A&S fields used. You can write an article for their Forestry Guild blog on a Medieval forestry related topic.

Create a persona-appropriate tinder pouch in cloth or leather. Crafting a scroll blank for Kingdom use with forestry related depiction or themes. Using calligraphy and/or Illumination for recreating forestry related depictions or documents; I personally think award scrolls would fit into this. Use period form to create poetry or song that incorporates period Forestry, hunts, or pertains to wild spaces. Create a piece of garb related to the Forestry Guild garb requirements. Creating and testing persona=appropriate foresterrelated gear such as canteens. Repair damaged or broken piece of Forester-related gear and post how you did it. Make a light source like a candle or an oil lamp using period materials. As you can see this covers the topic of A&S from Scribal, leather working, bardic, clothing, and possibly others.

The next focus area would be Education. This is something many in SCA already do. For points you can Teach an Online course, webinar, video or in-person class on a forestry topic. Take a mundane class or workshop in a Forestry-related field and write a post for the guild blog about your experience. Reading a book on a Forester-related topic and completing a written review of it for the Guild blog and Facebook group. The SCA has always been about learning and teaching and this help encourage that.

The Safety focus is one many tend to forget about when they are at events of doing activities. To help remind and encourage safe behavior there is this focus. The first point item is completing a certified first aid course; many are now online and have low cost. Next is creating a first aid Kit. This can be just a small belt-based kit for minor cuts, a larger kit for camp or a backcountry situation where first responders may take a long time to reach you. From my experience doing first aid at events previously I have seen it may times people go out with no first aid kits and think it will never happen to me. But it can, even a field marshal not fighting could get hit by accident and need first aid. I think this is a very important item here. The next safety item is Navigation, taking an online course in land or marine navigation or demonstrate proficiency with map and compass. Next would be a safety equipment kit for use in hiking or camping; either medieval or mundane, items would include for example a solar blanket, compass, whistle, first aid kit, etc. Many of these items I personally would also encourage for more than just SCA use. The last item they have for safety is Hunting a geocache, this is practical use of navigation.

Camping is the next focus. This is something many do at SCA events already but here it is a little more detailed. Do a Leave-no-trace backpacking or camping trip. Collect a kit of campsite tools and containers that would have been feasible pre-1600 such as cookpots and utensils. Next would be to set up a tarp-based shelter.

Hiking would be the next focus area with things starting at field test a medieval appropriate gear on a day hike trip or saunter. A saunter is a walk in a slow, relaxed manner, without

hurry or effort. Go on a 3-mile or more Hike for extra point do the hike in garb which includes period(ish) shoes. Insoles and modern soles are acceptable. For even more points take a hike of 5 or more miles in garb with period footwear just like under the 3-mile hike.

The next focus area is Voyaging. This is currently a short list but looks fun. Take a woodland ride on horseback for a mile while wearing Forester Garb. You can safely operate a paddled water vehicle. Take a trip of over 5 miles via a paddled water vehicle. For this I would encourage people to go in groups for safety, and it would make the trip better. The Aethelmearc guild had been posting about group trips, and it looked fun. I grew up canoeing and floating a river in a boat while fishing growing up. It was lots of fun with a small group.

Bushcraft is the next focus area. You can display knowledge of at least 3 different knots useful in outdoor situations. Find stones and cut a stick with it. Demonstrate the ability to knap flint and make a useful edged tool. Collect natural material and make five or more feet of cordage. Identify 3 edible plants that would be safe to forage and explain why and how to prepare them for consumption if necessary. Remember to exercise safety precautions and verify the plants are safe. You could Build a pack frame or a natural shelter. They give extra points for spending the night in it.

For the Firecraft/outdoor cooking area includes building, lighting fires and cooking. The first item is building a period fire-making kit with all the gear you need to make fire using two or more period methods. Build three types of wood structures for a fire and explain pros and cons of each. Create fire starters, examples would be char cloth, whittled wood shavings, wax based etc. Demonstrate a safe fire set up including a method for quick fire extinguishing. Light a wood fire safely; points vary on how but include using matches or magnesium fire starter, flint and steel or fire glass, and friction method. Also get credit for cooking an edible meal for four people over a wood fire. Always remember local laws, regulations and ground fire restrictions.

The last focus area is Environmental stewardship. Period Foresters were considered the caretakers of the land they oversaw so I consider essential continuation of work they started. You can earn a point for learning about and fulfill a wildlife habitat program for your home. No purchase necessary they list 2 websites with checklists that you just confirm you met. Go on a litter campaign the request 3 or more hours cleaning up neighborhood, local park, woodland or waterway. Many groups will hold events on these in your area. Plant a tree making sure to not use an invasive species. Learn about managed forests in your area, and if possible, take a field trip. Learn about hunting or fishing regulations in your area and why limitations are in place. Identify and remove invasive plants or insects from a section of your yard, friends' yard or public space.

Those are the current years items to earn points. They are openly discussing some ideas for next year. Some suggestions are to make a non-clothing item for winter Forster activities like a sleeping bag, skis, snowshoes or possibly a whole category of cold season itself. Discussion includes expanding resource management items. So, it looks like the next challenge will have even more stuff to do. One thing to always remember when doing SCA Forestry Activities is to follow mundane laws, CDC and local safety guidelines and well as good old common sense.

As it gets closer to September they will update the new point system, items and how to join in on the fun. I plan to make a list of items I plan on doing for the next challenge. Ansteorra has a Farm, Field and Forest Facebook group and an Ansteorra Foresters Guild group.
