Firestorm Ink and Scribal Guild

Greetings!

We are Firestorm Ink, a group of people from Wiesenfeuer (OKC) and Namron (Norman) that are interested in the medieval book arts.

Each quarter, we focus on a different style of illumination. We are currently in our second month of learning about Celtic Decorations and Uncial styles of Calligraphy.

Last month, we began a series of classes and work on Celtic scrolls. We began with a library and critiques night. At the library portion, we looked at periods sources of the main Celtic manuscripts, discussed the history, stylistic characteristics, and colors used in the original manuscripts and their modern equivalents

Then we critiqued scro<mark>lls that had been turn</mark>ed in, admiring those that were complete and identifying areas for tweaking on others.

The following week, Mistress Kajira camber taught a class in painting techniques in which we practiced several types of shading, discussed color mixing, and tried out new tools to make the distinctive red dots in Celtic scrolls. We had several participants, some new faces, some regular attendees, and some artists who we don't see as often.

The next week we put together our own sets of paint that included the modern equivalents of prevalent Celtic colors. We began painting on Celtic kingdom charters.

The following week we discussed color theory and did some color comparisons with the different colors in our Celtic pallets. We continued to paint on Celtic scrolls.

We meet at 7pm each Tuesday. We are currently looking for a new meeting location. To this ends, throughout March, our meeting location will be a bit fluid.

On Tuesday, March 1st we will be meeting at the Natural Grocers on 89th. For the other meeting days, please see the guild's facebook page for updates.

Tuesday the 1st - Celtic Embellishments class taught by Niccolaia. This class will show several ways that you can add interest to Celtic style scrolls and knot work.

Tuesday the 8th – Practice Celtic Embellishments on kingdom and baronial scrolls.

Tuesday the 15th - Celtic Award Scrolls Paint Night and Insular Majascule calligraphy practice Put your color palette and techniques to use as we continue to paint Celtic designs.


Tuesday the 22nd - Open painting and calligraphy practice Please bring your current project with you.

SCA heavy weapons fighting is based on the medieval ideal of the knight. All SCA combat is real and unchoreographed. The weapons are made of rattan. Loaner gear is available. a donation of \$2 per person per session is required.

Rapier Practice March 1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd, and 29th

Practices are sometimes cancelled due to weather or overlapping activities. Light weapons combat is an SCA form of combat used toward the end of the Middle Ages. Loaner gear is available. A donation of \$2 per person per session is encouraged.

Youth Combat March 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd, and 30th

Date: Wednesdays Time: 7pm - 8pm Place: Sellers Rec Center³
Youth combat is for boys and girls are 6 to 15 years. They fight with foam-padded weapons. There are 3 age divisions within the program; 6-9 years, 10-12 years, and 13-15 years. The armor requirements and the strength of blows allowed increase as a child progresses through the levels.

Beginning Equipment for Youth Combat:

Each new youth fighter should wear long pants, a long-sleeve shirt, closed-toe shoes, lightweight gloves, and groin protection. A parent or an adult designated by the parent needs to be present throughout the practice.

There is some loaner armor but anything you can provide yourself is helpful. Armor requirements vary by age but all ages will need a helmet with face guard (such as a hockey or lacrosse helmet) and a gorget (medium-weight leather with ½ inch closed-cell padding). Knee and elbow pads are required for the older kids and helpful for the younger. The full armor and weapon requirements and rules for combat may be found in the Complete Participants Handbook.
