## Youth Combat<sup>3</sup>

Date: Wednesdays Time: 7pm - 8pm

Place: Sellers Community Center 3 Youth combat is for boys and girls are 6 to 15 years. They fight with foam-padded weapons. There are 3 age divisions within the program; 6-9 years, 10-12 years, and 13-15 years. The armor requirements and the strength of blows allowed increase as a child progresses through the levels.

### Beginning Equipment for Youth Combat:

Each new youth fighter should wear long pants, a long-sleeve shirt, closed-toe shoes, lightweight gloves, and groin protection. A parent or an adult designated by the parent needs to be present throughout the practice.

There is some loaner armor but anything you can provide yourself is helpful. Armor requirements vary by age but all ages will need a helmet with face guard (such as a hockey or lacrosse helmet) and a gorget (medium-weight leather with ½ inch closed-cell padding). Knee and elbow pads are required for the older kids and helpful for the younger. The full armor and weapon requirements and rules for combat may be found in the Complete Participants Handbook. ## The Scrolls of Time: Chapter 4

The fourth installment of the translations of Ramhar Breadoir is counted as the four hundred and fifty-seventh most controversial work of the Harp and Lark scholars. The fact that this translation coincides with what the locals have dubbed “The Great, Infamous, Hideous Scandal of Last Tuesday” (or “The Other Day” for short) leaves many to gossip and wonder. A brief excerpt from the Knight's Marshal from Gulf Wars 27:

Well everyone, March held Gulf Wars 27 in Glean Abhann,. To those of you who made it out, and fought for the barony and Kingdom, Thank you! For those of you who could not follow us on the warpath, I have this report to make to you.

The Baronial Warband, The Flame Guard, managed to field 10 fighters, with grand new Scutum, freshly painted and proudly carried, wearing our Guard tabards, and bearing pennants on our spears. On Tuesday we fought the town battle twice. Wiesenfeuer was on the far left at first, assigned to take and hold a building, and support the bridge. For the second battle, Wiesenfeuer and Namron were both assigned to patrol the river to keep enemy chivalry from crossing. Both the first and the second battle were won by Ansteorra and allies.

Wednesday, we fought the ravine and I am very proud to report that Wiesenfeuer was assigned to the very center position, guarding the central point, which we were able to take and hold for 59 out of 60 minutes. In this objective, we fought alongside the Liondragon Guard and the Storm Guard of Namron, and were supported by a great number of archers, in keeping our goals were completely dominant.

Thursday, the field battle was fought five times. While Wiesenfeuer along with the rest of our army and our allies fought hard and played our objectives, we did not win the field. Finally on Friday it rained, but with no lightning in the sky, we still suited up and decided to bring the thunder of our own. We fought the bridge and the fort on Friday in the pouring rain. All of the participants numbers were vastly diminished by the storm, but Wiesenfeuer still fielded 5 fighters and Ansteorra 40. The bridges were hard fought battles and we fought our foes to a draw, but on the last pass a very fine moment occurred. Ansteorra and allies immediately upon lay on took the center of the bridge. Our foes, however did not take to the bridge and left it to us uncontested, instead forming on their bank and attempting to form a kill pocket. We did not advance en mass, but instead send duelists to attrite the enemy numbers, which left most of our army safe and outside of combat. There we were, 200 men, on a bridge in the pouring rain with little....

A continued brief excerpt from the Knight's Marshal from Gulf Wars 27:

...with little to do but alternately dodging or hurling thrown weapons at our foes. With little else to do our army took to singing, shields and feet keeping the beat. This took the chill from us and inspired us with a feeling of camaraderie and joy.

After this, it fell to us to defend the castle, somewhat outnumbered, which we held firmly until the final moments. Wiesenfeuer was assigned to hold the widows gate, and we did so for 6:5, then when the fort was taken, we formed up outside to retake the fort. Wiesenfeuer was tasked to take the sally port, which was not considered passable until two minutes had passed. In the two minutes before we could pass through the port, Wiesenfeuer had defeated all but one defender through the windows and crenellations. When we passed into the fort, we did so unopposed, and were able to walk right into the enemy's backfield. The enemy collapsed, and the fort was retaken, within 3:25. Half the time.

Off the field everywhere I looked I saw Wiesenfeuer volunteering, serving in parking, troll, and sanitation. I did not see the total of volunteer hours, but I know it will be very high. This is just a fraction of what took place at war, but it is all I can convey to you here. To those of you who could make it, thank you, and to those who could not, I hope to see you there next year!
