Youth Combat³

Place: Sellers Community Center 3 Youth combat is for boys and girls are 6 to 15 years. They fight with foam-padded weapons. There are 3 age divisions within the program; 6-9 years, 10-12 years, and 13-15 years. The armor requirements and the strength of blows allowed increase as a child progresses through the levels.

Beginning Equipment for Youth Combat:

Each new youth fighter should wear long pants, a long-sleeve shirt, closed-toe shoes, lightweight gloves, and groin protection. A parent or an adult designated by the parent needs to be present throughout the practice.

There is some loaner armor but anything you can provide yourself is helpful. Armor requirements vary by age but all ages will need a helmet with face guard (such as a hockey or lacrosse helmet) and a gorget (medium-weight leather with ½ inch closed-cell padding). Knee and elbow pads are required for the older kids and helpful for the younger. The full armor and weapon requirements and rules for combat may be found in the Complete Participants Handbook. The Scrolls of Time: Chapter 5

This is the fifth in a series of translations of the lost scrolls of Ian Cara Duinn Cac, as originally written by the ancient lore keeper, Ramhar Breadoir, and translated by three scholars of the Harp and Lark Pub, County Cork, Ireland.

Chapter 5—The Lesson of the Path

Yendel had slept for two days after climbing the Path of Patience and he was still exhausted. The journey took six days, traversing seven miles of steep gravel slopes. He grew weary just remembering the uneventful journey. To pass the time he had tried to count his steps, but on the third day, he awoke and couldn't remember how many steps he'd taken. Counting the steps had helped pass the time. So for the next two days he tried to estimate how many steps the seven mile trip would take. Yendel was never particularly good at sums and he hoped his calculations were correct. Seven miles at 5,280 feet per mile was 36, 960 feet. He estimated the span of his steps at three feet each, so under the best of circumstances, the trip would require 12, 320 steps. But for every five steps forward, he slid back four, so the journey would actually require at least 61,600 steps. At three feet per step, the total distance was 184, 800 feet, an unbelievable 35 miles of travel for only sevem miles of distance. Yendel had been surprised to realize that the mat problem actually helped pass the timefaster than counting steps, and Yendel's eternal optimism had been renewed by the fourth day. He new his calculations were only estimates and he wasn't really sur if his pace was exactly three feet. He didn't know if he slid back exactly twelve feet for every fifteen feet he progressed, because he didn't know for sure if five steps forward were actually fifteen feet. He knew there was room forerror. He probably overestimated his pace, because the trip felt much more like 61, 757 steps. Yendel started to recalculate the trip based on 32 inches per step, but his brain began to ache as much as his feet. He laughed when he realized the whole process would probably have been easier if he used metics in the first place.

But Yendel had learned a great deal from the trial. At first he had tried to think of ways to beat the trial. Foolishly, he thought impatience would somehow...

...help him pass a test of patience. He had hoped the Tunarian could life him to the top of the path as he flew, but the Tunarian was unable to life the additional weight and broke in half trying to fly away. Next, Yendel hoped the Tunarian's coat, with the fifty five meticulously placed buttons, might hold some magical power. He fantasized that the garment was actually the source of the Tunarian's flight and if he wore it, he would rise effortlessly to the top of the path. The fifty four remaining buttons were a test in themselves. Unfortunately, when he was done, he was only heavier and no closer to flight. He did like the cotehardie thought, and was glad he took it on the journey. But sliding on the gravel had worn it into a tattered rag and he left it alongside the path on the fifth day. He even imagined the buttons held some supernatural qualities. He rubbed them, struck them together, polished them, stacked them and blew on them. In the end, their only quality was that he liked them. He was glad he saved the buttons.

Yendel even thought if he walked up the slope backwards, he could trick the trial and possibly slide up the hill four steps instead of down the hill. Walking backwards uphill was difficult, and of course the theory failed.

He tried hopping, crawling, skipping, and weaving. Cartwheels uphill were especially difficult and produced no positive results. His hands hurt more than his feet. How many feet were in one cartwheel anyway? How many cartwheels would he have to do to travel thirty five miles? He was glad he didn't have to calculate the climb according to the length of a cartwheel, especially using metrics.

He slowly learned the real meaning of the trial, that patience can only be experienced, not tricked....practiced, not prevented...endured and not avoided. A test of patience could only be accomplished... by being patient. Like Sisyphus rolling the stone up his own mountain, only to have it roll down. Yendel knew his destiny...and found comfort.

Two tests were behind him and the lessons of each were surprisingly simple. The key to the Cave of Apathy was not caring. The secret of the Path of Patience was tolerant endurance.

"A cranberry cake and another nap!" he thought to himself, and curled up at the foot of Halthor's Ladder.
